CASA is a non-profit organization that recruits, trains, and supervises community volunteers to advocate for the abused and neglected children in states custody.

It cost approximately \$900 per child per year for a CASA advocate to be assigned. The assigned advocate stays with one or two children's cases until their cases are resolved, helping the court make the best placement decision for those children.
